SOLAR ENERGY

We installed 93.7 kilowatts of solar in 2019, which provides access to clean, reliable energy for 19 communities in Nicaragua, Nepal and Mexico.



30 Nicaraguan and Nepali women gained hands-on training while bringing solar to local communities, giving them the tools they need to launch a career in clean energy.



175 OFF-GRID HOMES NOW HAVE ELECTRICITY

Families no longer use expensive and hazardous lighting sources and have improved access to communication and information.

At first, villagers were asking, 'Why are these girls here? Boys can't even do such work, how can these girls do it?' But we did it!
